The Latch Appeal

All the profits from the production are to be donated to the Charity LATCH.

Children in Wales with cancer have been referred to **Llandough Hospital**, situated between Cardiff and Penarth, since 1970.

During that time their chances of survival have increased greatly, especially in relation to certain types of cancer. The price is years of unpleasant treatment for all. Treatment is provided by dedicated specialists and nurses, but the children are often many miles from home, surrounded by strangers who are not yet friends.

LATCH - Llandough Aims to Treat children with Cancer and Leukaemia with Hope - was launched in 1982 by a group of parents, friends and medical staff to support the special requirements of the Oncology Unit at Llandough, and the children within its care. Although **Llandough Hospital** has a proud medical record, the facilities in the Oncology Unit were not purpose built and as the numbers of children referred increased, so did the need for more and better facilities and amenities.

LATCH was able to help to a considerable degree, both in the provision of medical equipment and in the all round care of children and their families.

LATCH is a small but vibrant charity, and on its way to raising its second million pounds. Virtually nothing is spent on administration - the maximum amount possible is used for the benefit of the children unfortunate enough to suffer cancer. The charity maintains a small office within Llandough Hospital grounds, and 11 branches are now active across Wales.
